Need for Care

A vast range of causes result in alarming rates of upper-limb amputations worldwide – armed conflict, accident, disease, and lack of healthcare infrastructure. An estimated **2.3 million upper-limb amputees worldwide do not have access to a prosthetic arm** and face extremely limited access to care. [1,2,3]



*80% of upper limb amputees live in developing countries and **only 5%** of this population has access to care [1,2,3]*



VHP currently works with prosthetic clinics in **eleven countries** internationally, steadily expanding our reach to offer vital prosthetic care to more people in-need.







2022 Financials


All values in Canadian Dollars (\$CAD)
